**Summary of BAER Team Recommendations
Charlie Fire - 3,021 acres**

Soil/Water Resources

- Aerial or Drill seed 20 miles (100 acres) along dozer line
- Monitor for seeding success
- Rehabilitate 20 miles of dozer line
- Public safety restore drainage and grades to 3.25 miles of roads damaged by fire suppression

Wildlife Resources

- Monitor 3,021 acres of post fire vegetation in critical big game winter range and sage grouse habitat.

Forest/Woodland

- Monitor 600 acres of relic aspen/cottonwood stands for post fire regeneration to prevent unacceptable change to the ecosystem structure.

Cultural Resources

- Conduct field inventory on 300 acres of forested wood cutting areas that have high potential for containing significant cultural resources.
- Cultural resource inventory linear projects on 23.25 miles of bulldozer lines, road maintenance, and new fences.
- Assessment on one (1) historic wickiup structure damaged during the fire.
- Law enforcement presence for cultural resource protection

Infrastructure Resources

- No treatments

Vegetation Resources

- Monitor and treat for noxious weed as needed
- Monitoring of burned area for natural rangeland vegetation and recovery from fire effects.
