## **RANGE WORKING GROUP MEETING SCHEDULED**

The first South Buckhorn Allotment Working Group meeting will be held at the BLM Elko Field Office, 3900 East Idaho Street, Elko, Nevada, on Wednesday, December 10, 2003. The meeting will begin at 10:00 a.m. and should be done by noon. The purpose of this first meeting is to establish goals and the overall direction of the working group. The public is invited to attend.

The South Buckhorn allotment (southwest of Carlin and south of I-80) encompasses 315,000 acres of intermingled public and private lands, of which 219,000 acres are publicly owned.

Thirty people representing a wide diversity of organizations and interests toured the South Buckhorn allotment this past October. Group discussions on the tour covered a range of concerns that impact range conditions such as horses, livestock use, effects of wildfire, drought, riparian conditions, grasshoppers and Mormon crickets, soils, mining, water quality, fencing, and more.

One result of the tour was that people wanted to work together in a collaborative effort to go forward with the goal of meeting Rangeland Health Standards and Guidelines that were adopted for public lands in Nevada.
