INSTRUMENT

This survey was made with a Buff & Berger Mountain
Transit; the courses were deflected from the true
Meridian as determined by an observation on Polaris
at its Eastern elongation.

The distances were measured with 500 and 100 ft.
steel tapes.

SURFACE

The surface embraced by this claim is low and arid
hills, devoid of all growth except small varieties of
Yucca Palm and Greaswood. It is the typical desert
country of Southern Nevada, and is void of all natural
objects for bearing points.

NOTE:- The difference between length and course of
lode line of this survey and the location certificate is
due to errors in the latter, the boundaries of this
survey being identical with the location.

REPORT:- After diligent search, the W. 1/4 Cor. Sec.
29, T. 28 S., R. 61 E., M.D.M. could not be found.
