S U R F A C E

The surface embraced by this claim is low and arid hills, devoid of any growth except small varieties of Yucca Palm and Greasewood. It is the typical desert country of Southern Nevada, and is void of all natural objects for bearing objects.

NOTE:- The difference between length and course of lode line of this Survey and the location certificate is due to errors in the latter, the boundaries of this Survey being identical with the location.

REPORT:- After diligent search, W. 1/4 Cor. Sec. 29 could not be found.

The monument marking the corner to Secs. 19, 20, 29 and 30, T. 28 S., R. 61 E., M.D.M. is a dark colored rock, 6 x 8 inches square, 8 inches above the ground with mound of stone, chiseled 4 notches North and 5 notches East.

Corner No. 4, Survey No. 2571, The Old California Mining Claim is a pine post 4 ins. square, set 2-1/2 ft. in a mound of earth and stone, scribed 4-2571.
