✓ SURFACE

The surface embraced in this survey is composed of high hills and deep gulches, void of timber and other natural objects for bearings.

✓ Note:- The differences between these field notes and the certificate of location, are due to errors in the latter.

✓ REPORT:- After dilligent search the South 1/4 Cor. and the West 1/4 Cor. to Sec. 23, Tp. 28-S., T. 61-E., M.D.M., could not be found.

The Cor. to Secs.22,23,26 and 27, Tp. 28-S., R. 61-E., M.D.M., is a dark granite rock 10 x 16 ins. 20 ins. above the ground with mound of rock, chiseled 2 notches East and 2 notches South.

The North Side Center Iowa Lode reported in this survey is a yucca post 5 ins. in diameter, 4 ft. above the ground with mound of rock, marked N. Side Center Iowa.

S.W.Corner Lone Star Lode reported in this survey is a yucca post 6 ins. in diameter, 4 ft. above the ground, with mound of rock, marked "S.W.Corner Lone Star Mine".

The discovery monument of Lone Star Lode reported in this Survey is a yucca post 7 ins. in diameter 4-1/2 ft. above the ground with mound of stone marked "Discovery Lone Star Mine".

N.E.Cor. Iowa Lode reported in this survey is a yucca post 6 ins. in diameter, 4-1/2 ft. above the ground, with mound of stone and earth, marked "N.East Corner Iowa".
