- No. 2. A tunnel, 4 x 6 ft. 27 ft. long in rock running S. 6° W., the portal of which bears N. 42° 35' W. from Cor. No. 1, 446 ft. Value- - - - - \$216.00
- No. 3. A vertical shaft 4 x 6 ft. 30 ft. deep in rock the center of which bears N. 37° 50' W. 427 ft. from Cor. No. 1. Value- - - - - \$300.00
- No. 4. A vertical shaft, 4 x 6 ft, 25 ft. deep in rock, the center of which bears N. 40° 38' W. 405 ft. from Cor. No. 1. Value- - - - - \$250.00

OTHER IMPROVEMENTS.

There are no other improvements upon this claim.

I N S T R U M E N T.

This survey was made with a C.L.Berger and Sons No. 4 Transit. The courses were deflected from the true meridian as determined by a direct solar observation. The distances were measured with 500 ft. and 100 ft. steel tapes.

S U R F A C E.

The surface embraced in this survey is low and arid hills, void of all growth except small varieties of yucca and greasewood. It is the typical desert country of southern Nevada and there are no natural objects for bearings.

N O T E

The differences between these field notes and the location certificate are due to errors in the latter.

REPORT:- The Government Corner to Secs. 29,28,32 and 33, Tp. 29-S., R. 61-E,M.D.M. mentioned in this survey is a dark colored rock 5x8 inches, 18 ins. above the ground in mound of rock, chiseled 4 notches East and 1 notches South.
