

FINAL OATHS FOR SURVEYS.

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tie to the above section corner, as reported in the amended certificate of location, was calculated from a traverse run from Cor. No. 1 of this survey to the Cor. to Secs. 17, 18, 19 and 20, said Cor. to Secs. 8, 9, 16 and 17 not having been found at the time of the location survey, owing to the rugged nature of the surrounding country.

Report:-- The Cor. to Secs. 8, 9, 16 and 17, T. 28 S., R. 61 E., Mt. Diablo B. & M., is a black gneiss rock, of the shape of an inverted keystone, 14 ins. long, 10 ins. wide at the bottom, 5 ins. wide at the top, projecting half its height above a mound of rock and sand, marked with two notches on its west edge, and with two notches on its north edge.

The S. 1/4 Cor. Sec. 8, T. 28 S., R. 61 E., Mt. Diablo B. & M., could not be found, after strict and diligent search.

The Cor. to Secs. 7, 8, 17 and 18, T. 28 S., R. 61 E., Mt. Diablo B. & M., to which connection is given in lieu of the S. 1/4 Cor. Sec. 8, is a black gneiss rock, 14 ins. wide, 9 ins. thick, standing 16 ins. above the surface, and marked with one notch on its west edge, and with two notches on its north face.

The surface of this survey consists of rolling foothills, sparsely covered with greasewood and a few scattered yucca palms and an occasional juniper tree of small size, but is devoid of natural landmarks to which bearings could be taken from the several corners thereof.

All lines of this survey, and the respective tie lines to the Cor. to Secs. 8, 9, 16 and 17, and to the Cor. to Secs. 7, 8, 17 and 18, T. 28 S., R. 61 E., Mt. Diablo B. & M., were made by separate and distinct traverses, all lines of which were run direct upon the ground.

There are no adjoining or conflicting locations, this survey being entirely surrounded by vacant public land.

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
