No. 1. The discovery shaft of the Ute lode, which bears from the discovery monument N.11°46'W. 26 ft., 4x6 ft., 67 ft. deep, in rock.

No. 2. A shaft which bears from the discovery monument N.36°24'E. 31 ft., 4x6 ft., 8 ft. deep, in rock.

## OTHER IMPROVEMENTS.

There are no other improvements on this claim.

## INSTRUMENT.

This survey was made with a C. L. Berger mining transit No. 4270. The courses were deflected from the true meridian as determined by observation on Polaris at Western elongation. The distances were measured with 100-ft. and 500-ft. steel tapes.

## REPORT.

The lode line of this claim was run directly upon the ground, and the several corners established by means of offsets from the lode line. All tie lines were run directly upon the ground.

The N. W. Cor. Sec. 18, T. 28 S., R. 64 E., M.D.M., is a granite rock, 8x12 ins., standing 15 ins. above the ground, chiseled with six notches on the West face and two notches on the North face.

This is the nearest standing corner of the public survey that can be found and identified.
