OTHER IMPROVEMENTS.

A shaft which bears from the discovery monument, Golden Garter lode, N.59°33'W. 15.5 ft., 4x6 ft., 39 ft. deep. I believe this shaft was sunk by one Tom Marsh, for the benefit of the Franklin lode, unsurveyed, an attempted relocation of the Golden Garter lode. I am informed that said attempted relocation has long since been relinquished.

INSTRUMENT.

This survey was made with a Buff and Buff mining transit No. 4604. The courses were deflected from the true meridian, as determined by observation on Polaris at western elongation. The distances were measured with 100-ft. and 500-ft. steel tapes.

REPORT.

The lode line of each location of this claim was run directly upon the ground, and the several corners established by means of offsets from the lode lines. All tie lines were run either directly upon the ground, or by traverses, run upon the ground, and submitted in a separate report herewith.
