From this point the 1/2 mile cor. bet. monuments 128 and 129, on the state boundary, bears N.45°54'W., 13.48 chs. dist.; described in the field notes of the Portion of the California-Nevada State Boundary resurveyed under this group.

At a point on the California-Nevada State Boundary, west of the 1/2 sec. cor. of secs 5 and 6.

Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. diam., 27 ins. in the ground, for 1/2 sec. cor. of sec. 6, with brass cap mkd.

raise a mound of stone, 3 ft. base, 2 ft. high, E. of cor.

From this point the 1 mile cor. bet. monuments 128 and 129 on the state boundary, bears N.45°54'W., 1.54 chs. dist.; described in the field notes of the Portion of the California-Nevada State Boundary, resurveyed under this group.

There is no final test of the solar attachment to be recorded, The bearings of all lines in this township were checked by deflection from the line of the California-Nevada State Boundary.

GENERAL DESCRIPTION

The land in the resurveyed portion of fractional T. 29 S., R. 61 E., varies from rolling mountainous to rolling and nearly level washland, The New York Range of mountains, which is the dividing ridge between Piute Valley and Ivanpah dry lake, bears NE. from SW. in frac. sec. 22, through sec. 23, then NW. to the line bet. secs. 14 and 15, then NE. The general drainage is SE. to Piute Valley or W. and NW. to Ivanpah dry lake. The highest point in the township on the line bet. secs. 14 and 15, is about 5,600 ft. above sea level.

The soil varies from sandy clayloam, about 2nd rate, to sandy gravelly and rocky loam, 3rd and 4th rate.

There is some scrub juniper on the portion of the township which lies to the south of the divide, also some scrub juniper on the immediate slope from the divide to the northwest. The undergrowth is jushua, sagebrush, yucca and cacti, the jushua assuming the proportions of trees.

There is no surface water in the township. There is also no indication of mineral bearing ground. Two or three old roads in the northern portion of the township are now abandoned, but they all converge in approximately sec. 3, to a road which bears northerly to the old town of Crescent.
