

Resurvey of a Portion of the Subdivisions of

Fractional T. 30 S., R. 62 E.

Chains. Land, rolling and mountainous.
 Soil, gravelly, 3rd rate; and rocky, 4th rate.
 No timber.
 Undergrowth, scattered joshua, cactus, creosote brush and sage.

 South, on a true line bet. secs. 8 and 9.

Over mountainous land, through scattered timber and undergrowth.

Descend 90 ft. over SE. slope.

17.33 Wash, 80 lks. wide, course NE.; asc. 480 ft. over NW. slope.

23.33 Spur, slopes NE.

33.33 Same spur, slopes NW., continue ascending.

37.83 Top of same spur, slopes NE.; asc. 22 ft. over NE. slope.


39.82 At this point which is midway in lat. bet. the NW. cor. of sec. 9 and the closing cor. of frac. secs. 9 and 16 on the state boundary,

Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. diam., 12 ins. in the ground to bedrock, with a stone mkd. X, deposited at the base, and in a mound of stone to top, for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor., with brass cap mkd.



43.33 Desc. 95 ft. over precipitous SE. slope. Intersect the California-Nevada State Boundary.

Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 2 ins. diam., on surface rock, with a cross (X) mkd. at the base, and in a mound of stone to top, for closing cor. of frac. secs. 8 and 9, with brass cap mkd.



 From point of intersection the $\frac{1}{2}$ mile cor. bet. monuments 132 and 133 on the state boundary, bears S.45°47'E., 32 lks. dist.; described in the field notes of the Portion of the California-Nevada State Boundary, resurveyed under this group.

Land, mountainous.
 Soil, rocky; 4th rate.
 Timber, scattered juniper.
 Undergrowth, cactus, creosote brush and yucca.

 From the cor. of secs. 4, 5, 8, and 9,

West, on a true line bet. secs. 5 and 8.
