

Resurvey of a Portion of the California- Nevada State Boundary.

Chains.

The present California-Nevada State Boundary was surveyed by the U. S. Coast and Geodetic Survey in 1900.

The following notes describe a resurvey of that portion of the California- Nevada State Boundary between Monuments 129 and the Colorado River.

Previous to resurveying the California-Nevada State line bet. Monuments 129 and 141, I cause flags to be set at each monument, making it unnecessary to run random lines between consecutive monuments.

Beginning at Monument 129 on the California-Nevada State Boundary, which is a redwood post, 4 ins. sq., 1 ft. exposed, set in a mound of stone 5 ft. base and 3 1/2 ft. high, and marked with tacks: 129 on NW., N on NE., and O on SW. sides.

S.45°50'E., on tangent and true line bet. Monuments 129 and 130.

Over rolling land, through scattered creosote, cactus and yucca.

Descend 50 ft.

3.00 Gully, course NE.; asc. 55 ft. over NW. slope.

8.40 Spur, slopes NE.; desc. 185 ft. to cor.

24.50 Foot of hill, bears NE. and SW.; desc. gradually.

26.50 Wash, 60 lks. wide, course SW. Enter valley.

30.00 Wash, 100 lks. wide, course W.

40.00 Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. diam., 27 ins. in the ground for 1/2 mile cor., with brass cap mkd.

and raise a mound of stone, 3 ft. base, 2 ft. high SW. of cor.

51.00 Wash, 60 lks. wide, course W.; asc. 45 ft.

80.00 Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 2 ins. diam., 27 ins. in the ground, for 1 mile cor., with brass cap mkd.

and raise a mound of stone, 3 ft. base, 2 ft. high, SW. of cor.

Land, rolling and level. Soil, gravelly, 3rd rate; and stony 4th rate. Timber, none. Undergrowth, creosote brush, cactus and yucca.
