BURNED AREA EMERGENCY REHABILITATION PLAN AND ACCOMPLISHMENT REPORT
Summary of BAER Team Recommendations
Camp Creek Fire (part of O'Neil Basin Complex) - 31,194 acres**

Soil/Water Resources

- Rehabilitate 23 miles of roads
- Aerial or Drill seed 4 miles (19.4 acres) along dozer line
- Monitor for seeding success
- Public safety restore drainage and grades to 5 miles BLM and 1 mile Elko County roads damaged by fire suppression

Wildlife Resources

- Aerially seed **4,173 acres** in swaths within the 20,356-acre BLM public lands burn perimeter. (Equals one 8,320-acre area seeded every other swath and two areas encompassing 12,036 acres seeded every third swath).
- Dribble seed with light dozer bitterbrush on **2,434 acres** within areas that total 2,660 acres between Goat Creek and Cottonwood Creek.
- Monitor seeding success on 6,607 acres.
- 4.55 miles of protective fence for Lahontan Cutthroat Trout Habitat on Wildcat Creek. The trout is federally listed threatened and endangered species.
- Monitor post fire recovery on 3.5 miles of Lahontan Cutthroat Trout Habitat.
- Monitor 20,356 acres of post fire vegetation in critical big game winter range and sage grouse habitat.

Forest/Woodland

- Monitor 200 acres of relic aspen/cottonwood stands for post fire regeneration to prevent unacceptable change to the ecosystem structure.

Cultural Resources

- Cultural resource inventory linear projects on 25.2 miles of bulldozer lines, road maintenance, and new fences.
- Law enforcement presence for cultural resource protection
- Cultural resource inventory drill seeding project on 2,434 acres

Infrastructure Resources

- No treatments

Vegetation Resources

- Broadcast/hay mulch 262 acres rangeland and monitor for success
- Monitoring of burned area for natural rangeland vegetation and recovery from fire effects.
- Aerial seed 784 acres of rangeland and monitor for success
- Replace 16.3 miles of protective fence
- Reconstruct 10.3 miles of protective fence
- 20.2 miles of new protective fence
- 3 miles of temporary electric protective fence
- Noxious weed monitoring and inventory 15,000 acres
- Herbicide control of 500 acres of noxious weed
