Wild Horse and Burro Adoption Slated for October 12

Las Vegas - On Sunday, October 12, beginning at 8 a.m., the Bureau of Land Management will offer xx horses at its annual Wild Horse and Burro Adoption at Henderson Saddle Association (6490 Weisner Way.) All horses are from southern Nevada herds.

The National Wild Horse Association will showcase previously adopted animals at their annual Wild Horse Show on October 11 and 12. The show will start at 8 a.m. and will also take place at Henderson Saddle Association.

Previously adopted wild horses and burros have gone on to be part of chuck wagon teams, mounts in the U.S. Marine Corps Color Guard as well as winning precision drills, dressage competitions, endurance and stock horse competitions.

In addition to free pre-adoption clinics, monthly low-cost training clinics are offered for adopters and those interested in learning training techniques.

The October 12 adoption will require \$125 minimum bid. Potential adopters must have a minimum 400 square foot six foot high (four and a half feet for burros) pipe or wood corral with a confined area with at least two-sided shelter with a roof. Adopters must not have been convicted of animal cruelty and title to the animal remains with the government for a year.

All animals available for adoption are healthy, have initial vaccines and come with health care records. To learn more about adopting a wild horse or burro, please call 702-515-5106.
