Chains

Beginning at Cor. No. 1, identical with F. S. M. No. 1 which I destroy and set at the same point a porphyry stone 4x10x24 ins. in a substantial mound of stone (soil being washed away) 4 ft. base 2 ft. high in the NE. cor. of a fence, chiseled H-1-39 on south face; "thence a $\frac{1}{4}$ std" sec" cor" on the 9th, Std" Parallel North and the south bdy" of sec. 35. Tp. 46 N. R. 53 E. M.D.B. and M. bears S. 17° 12' W. 43.40 chs. This cor" consists of a quartzite stone 5x7x8 ins. above ground, set in a dim mound of earth, chiseled S.C. $\frac{1}{4}$ on the north side. Pits 5 ft. E. and W. Cor. No. 1, a granite stone 6x8x10 ins. above ground of Thomas Stinton's homestead claim, bears N. 80° 10' E. 10.94 chs. A cross and B.R. chiseled on the face of a rock in place bears N. 84° E. 52 lks.

Thence S 74° 40' W. Across river bottom.

7.00 Right bank of Owyhee River 70 lks. wide, course nearly north.

11.00 Foot of bench land.

11.40 To Cor" No. 2, identical with F.S.M. No. 2, a granite stone set in the ground, showing 4x8x10 ins. above, chiseled F.S.M.-H-2-39. A mound of stone 2 ft. base $1\frac{1}{2}$ ft. high bears South 7 lks. A cross and W.M. chiseled on the face of a granite boulder in place 5x8 ft. above ground bears N. 8° E. 55 lks. A $\frac{1}{4}$ std" sec" cor" on the 9th, Std" Parallel North (noted from cor. 1) bears S. 2° 45' W. 38.50 chs.

Thence N. 24° 00' W. Ascending

4.00 Top of low ridge. Descending slightly.

18.00 Clump of willows.

26.70 To cor. No. 3, identical with F.S.M. No. 3, a blackish granite stone set in the ground, showing 6x8x10 ins. chiseled F.S.M.-H-3-39 on east face. A mound of stone 2 ft. base $1\frac{1}{2}$ ft. high, bears N.E. 4 lks. A cross and B.R. chiseled on the face of a rock in place $1\frac{1}{2}$ x 4 ft. above ground, bears N. 48° W. 90 lks. A steel bolt 1 in. diameter driven in the ground with expanded copper top lettered S.C. $\frac{1}{4}$ sec" 36, official U.S. Survey. Pits to E. and W. substantial mound of earth alongside, bears S. 83° 45' E. 7.50 chs. S.E. cor. of Duck Valley Indian Reservation, bears S. 89° 22' W. 73.50 chs.

Thence N. 7° 53' E. Ascending slightly.

12.00 Top of low point. Descending slightly.

26.06 To corner No. 4, identical with F.S.M. No. 4. This stone being broken I destroyed it and replaced at same point. A quartz stone 10x 12 x 26 inches, set 14 ins. in the ground, chisled H-4-39 on north face. A mound of stone 2 feet base 2 feet high touching on touching on south side. A cross and B.R. chisled on the face of a rock in place showing 1x3 feet above ground, bears N. 35° E. 30 lks.

Thence N. 16° 00' W. Along a flat.

25.00 To cor. No. 5. Identical with F.S.M. No. 5, a granite stone set in the ground showing 8x10x10 ins. above, chisled F.S.M.-H-5-39 on east face. Placed a mound of stone 2 foot base 2 feet high touching on southside. A cross and B. R. chisled on the face of a rock in place 3x6 feet above ground, bears S. 43° 30' E. 32 lks. A cottonwood post 4x6 ins square 20 ins. above ground set in a substantial mound of stone and earth scribed S.B.-2-3986 bears S. 6° 15' W. 5.30 chs.

Thence N. 63° 35' W. Ascending slightly.

6.30 To corner No. 6. Identical with F.S.M. No. 6. A quartz stone set in the ground showing 8x8x10 ins above, chisled F.S.M.-H-6-39. Placed a mound of stone 2ft. base 2 ft. high touching north side. This corner stands just on the brow of the bench. No bearings available.

Thence N. 82° 15' E. Descend.

1.00 To River bottom, along same through willows.
