Survey commenced November 9, 1913, and executed with

W. & L. E. Gurley Light Mountain Transit No. 12968,
equipped with Burt solar attachment, the horizontal
limb having two double verniers, placed opposite
each other, and reading to single minutes of the
arc. Measurements made with Lufkin 2-chain steel
tape and stadia, using Philadelphia leveling rod
fitted with two targets having verniers reading to
.001 foot. I test the stadia interval against the
steel tape and find that 1 foot intersected on the
rod is equal to 2 chains from the center of the
transit. I examine the adjustments of the transit,
finding all adjustments correct.

November 9, 1913, I set up over the cor. of Secs. 8, 9, 16 and 17, T. 17 N., R. 44 E., which is a blue limestone, 9 x 7 x 4 ins. above ground, mkd. with 4 notches on the E. and 4 notches on the S. and witnessed by four properly scribed bearing trees, and at 9 h. 45 m., A.M., l.m.t. (my watch being correct to within a few seconds) I set off 16° 49' S. on the declination arc, 39° 21'Non the latitude arc, and determine a meridian with the solar, and to this meridian all courses of this survey are referred.
