Chains. A diorite rock in place, 6 x 5 x 2 ft. above ground,  
marked x-5-HES-48-BR, bears N. 49° 42' E., 60½ lks.  
dist.

Thence S. 21° 56' E. ✓  
Along base of hill.

2.40 Dry drainage, course SW.

2.50 Fence bears NW. and SE.

8.40 Fence bears SW. and NE.

44.47 To Cor. 6, identical with Cor. H-2 of the listing survey,  
(and with Cor. 9 of H.E.S. No. 47), a granite boulder,  
marked and witnessed as described by the Sur. Gen.,  
in place of which I set a granite stone, 24 x 16 x 7  
ins., 14 ins. in the ground over a granite stone, 16  
x 16 x 7 ins., marked with a cross (x); marked 6-HES  
48 on side facing the claim, 9-HES-47 on S. face,  
with cross (x) on top for Cor. 6 of this survey.
