ground, mkd. X-1-HES-68-BR, bears N. $81^{\circ}58'$ W.,
42 lks. dist.

Cor. H-6 of the listing survey, a quartzite stone,
firmly set, mkd. as described by the Surveyor
General, bears N. $40^{\circ}54'$ W., 1.62 chs., dist.

I destroy it.

Cor. 1 was not set identical with Cor. H-6 of the list-
ing survey on account of excess in length of the
listing survey.

The cor. between Secs. 35 and 36, T. 46 N., R. 53 E., on
the Old Ninth Standard Parallel North (survey
accepted), a granite stone, firmly set, mkd. with
5 notches on the W. face, and 1 notch on the E.
face, and witnessed by pits, N., E. and W., bears
N. $6^{\circ}50'$ E., 113.08 chs. dist.

Ascend SE. slope, sagebrush and slide rock.

0.54 Fence bears NW. and SE.

11.00 About 40 ft. above Cor. 1. Descend, SW. slope.

23.50 Fence bears NW. and SE.

26.00 Leave sage; enter cultivation, bears NW. and SE., about
100 ft. below point of descent.

47.00 Leave cultivation; enter sage, bears N. and S., ascend.

49.00 Spur S., about 40 ft. above meadow.

Descend.

52.00 About 50 ft. below spur, over level land.

58.00 Ascend.

64.00 About 25 ft. above point of ascent.

Descend.

66.55 Creek, 3 lks. wide, 4 ins. deep, flows SW., about 20
