Chains

A blue limestone ledge, 10 ft. high, mkd. X-6-HES-BR, bears S. 30° 14' W., 12 lks. dist.

A blue limestone ledge, 20 ft. high, mkd. X-6-HES-68-BR, bears N. 64° 20' W., 46 lks. dist.

I destroy the witness for Forest Service Monument and listing Cor. H-1

May 12, 1914.

Cor. H-9 of List No. 4-428, a granite stone, firmly set, mkd. H-9 on the N. face, and which will be identical with Cor. 7 of H. E. S. No. 63 (survey unapproved), a quartzite stone, firmly set, showing 10 ins. above ground, mkd. 7-HES-63 on the N. face and a cross (x) on the top, and witnessed by a mound of stone, bears N. 42° 01' E., 36.93 chs. dist.

May 14, 1914.

Thence

N. 69° 16' E.

Descend over sagebrush land.

1.64 Road, bears NW. and SE.

2.71 Owyhee River, 40 lks. wide (depth not known) flows NW. about 75 ft. below Cor. 6.

Ascend.

8.28 To Cor. 1, the place of beginning, about 40 ft. above river.

AREA

Area of H. E. S. No. 68 is 115.39 acres.

The Owyhee River being impassable at points on line, the stadia was used to obtain distances across it.
