N.  $89^{\circ} 25'$  E.

On a random line on the south boundary of Sec. 36.

11.11 Set a temporary stake for closing cor. and Cor. No. 1, of this entry survey hereafter described.

39.71 Strike the  $\frac{1}{4}$  cor. on the south side of Sec. 36, T. 46 N., R. 53 E.

This therefore is seen to be a true line.

Beginning at the cor. of Secs. 35 and 36, T. 46 N.,

R. 53 E. (survey accepted), on the Old Ninth Standard Parallel North previously described

Thence

S.  $89^{\circ} 58'$  W.

On a random line on the south boundary of Sec. 35.

1.35 Strike the SW. cor. of Sec. 31, T. 46 N., R. 54 E., hereafter described.

14.54 Set a temporary stake for closing cor. and Cor. No. 7 of this survey, hereafter described.

40.00 Strike the  $\frac{1}{4}$  cor. on the south boundary of Sec. 35, T. 46 N., R. 53 E. of Scully survey (accepted) which is a granite stone, firmly set, mkd., and witnessed as described by the Surveyor General.

This therefore is seen to be a true line.

Beginning at the SE. cor. of Sec. 36, T. 46 N., R. 53 E.,

on the new Ninth Standard Parallel North as surveyed by F. E. Joy which is an iron post, with a brass cap marked Sec. 36, R. 53, T. 46 N., with six notches on W. edge
