Chains

- 0.96 Iron irrigation pipe, 12 ins. in diameter, on edge of left bank of Owyhee River, bears NW. and SE.
- Left bank of river 20 ft. high, course NW.
- 2.60 Right bank of Owyhee river, level with river, course NW., rapid current, clear water, 24 ins. deep. Over sandy river bottom covered with willows.
- 6.99 To Cor. No. 10, identical with listing Cor. H-12, on right bank of Owyhee River, a lava stone marked as described by the Surveyor General in place of which I set an aspen post, 3 ft. long, 4 ins. square, 24 ins. in the ground over a quart of broken glass, marked 10-HES-76 on side facing the claim with tack in top for Cor. 10 of this survey; no bearings, therefore, raise a mound of earth 4 ft. base, 2 ft. high, $3\frac{1}{2}$ ft. dist., within the claim. Pits impracticable.
- Cor. 1 of H. E. Survey No. 39, a stone, set alongside of a wooden post, marked PC-10, bears N. 59° $17'$ E., 7.00 chs. dist.
- Thence
N. 71° $56'$ E.
- Over river bottom covered with willows.
- 1.05 Leave river bottom.
- 1.18 Wire fence bears NW. and SE.; enter plowed ground, bears NE. and SE.
- Along wire fence.
- 7.82 Wire fence bears NW. and SE.
- Leave plowed ground, bears SW. and SE.
- 15.06 Stage road, Tuscarora to Mountain City, bears NW. and SE., ascend 20 feet over lava side hill.
- 17.72 To Cor. No. 11, identical with listing Cor. H-1 and F.S.M. a lava stone, marked as described by the Surveyor General, in place of which I set a lava
