Chains

- Across level land.
- 84.95 To Cor. 2, identical with Cor. H-2 of the listing survey, which is a wooden post, firmly set, mkd. as described by the Sur. Gen., in place of which I set a granite stone, 25 x 16 x 6 ins., 15 ins. in the ground, over broken glass, for Cor. 2 of this survey, mkd. 2-HES-92 on side facing the claim, and a cross (+) on top. No bearings, therefore dig pits, 24 x 24 x 12 ins., crosswise on this and the succeeding course, 7 ft. dist., and raise a mound of earth, 4 ft. base, 2 ft. high, $3\frac{1}{2}$ ft. dist., within the claim.
- Cor. H-1 of List 4-1413, which is a lava stone, firmly set, mkd. H-1, bears N. $61^{\circ} 46' W.$, 194 chs. dist.

- N. $30^{\circ} 48' E.$,
- Ascend through sage and grass.
- .02 Fence cor., from which fences bear N. $30^{\circ} 48' E.$, and SE.
- Follow fence line.
- 5.78 Fence cor., from which fences bear N. $30^{\circ} 48' E.$, and S. $30^{\circ} 48' W.$, and W.
- 23.85 To Cor. 3, about 55 ft. above Cor. 2, identical with Cor. H-3 of the listing survey, and Cor. H-2 of List 4-767, (and when surveyed will be identical with Cor. 6 of H. E. S. 107), which is a wooden post, firmly set, mkd. and witnessed, as described by the Sur. Gen. I destroy the markings for List 4-766, and alongside to the south, set a granite stone, 24 x 16 x 8 ins., 14 ins. in the ground, over broken glass, for Cor. 3 of this survey, mkd. 3-HES-92 on side facing the claim and a cross (+)
