Chains

- 71.52 Rain Creek, about 65 ft. below point of descent, 200.9
lks. wide, 12 ins. deep, flows N.
Ascend.
- 74.53 Fence cor., from which fences bear SW., and S. 65° 42'
W.
- 74.55 To Cor. 4, about 20 ft. above Rain Creek, identical with
Cor. H-2 of the listing survey, which is a stone,
firmly set, mkd. and witnessed as described by the
Sur. Gen., in place of which, I set a granite stone,
24 x 14 x 10 ins., 14 ins. in the ground, over a
stone, 4 x 3 x 2 ins., mkd. with a cross (+) for
Cor. 4 of this survey, mkd. 4-HES-111 on side facing
the claim, and a cross (+) on top. No bearings,
therefore dig pits, 24 x 24 x 12 ins., crosswise
on this and the succeeding course, 7 ft. dist., and
raise a mound of earth and stone, 4 ft. base, 2 ft.
high, 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ ft. dist., within the claim.
I destroy the witnesses to the listing cor., which were
not suitable for bearing objects:
Cor. 2 of H. E. S. 92 (unapproved), which is a granite
stone, firmly set, showing 10 ins. above ground, mkd.
2-HES-92 on the NE. face and witnessed by pits and
mound of earth, bears N. 8° 58' E., 51.16 chs. dist.,
by traverse (computations of which are hereto
attached), as follows:
N. 20° 34' E., 13.17 chs.
N. 5° 01' E., 38.35 "

S. 8° 43' W.
Ascend over grassland.
Wire fence, parallel to course, bears W. 2 lks. dist.
- 28.83 To Cor. 1, about 30 ft. above Cor. 4, the place of
beginning.
