1.27 Wire fence, bears NE. and SW.

3.92 Wire fence, bears E. and W.

9.68 Wire fence, bears N. 76° W., and S. 76° E.

13.95 To Cor. 7, about 20 ft. above Cor. 6, identical with Cor. H-11 of the listing survey, which is a post, firmly set, mkd. and witnessed as described by the Sur. Gen., and Cor. 6 of H. E. S. No. 102, which is a granite stone, firmly set, along side the listing cor. showing 10 ins. above ground, mkd. 6-HES-102 on NW. face and a cross (x) on top, witnessed by a mound of stone, 3½ ft. dist., NW. of cor. and by one bearing rock.

I destroy the listing cor. and its witnesses, and mark the stone last described, 7-HES-114 on NE. face, for Cor. 7 of this survey and raise a mound of earth and stone 4 ft. base, 2 ft. high, 3½ ft., dist., within the claim.
