Cor. No. 1 of H. E. S. No. 117 (unapproved), which is a granite rock showing 10 ins. above ground, firmly set, mkd. 1-HES-117 on the N. face and a cross (x) on top, and properly witnessed by pits and a mound of earth, bears N. 50° 00' E., 59.00 chs. dist., by traverse, as follows, computations of which are hereto attached:

S. 87° 18' E., 45.16 chs.

N. 0° 08' E., 40.05 "

Over level land, through sagebrush.

- 2.30 Leave sage, enter cultivation, bears NW. and SE.
- 4.60 Leave cultivation, enter sage, bears NW. and SE.
- 7.80 Ditch 3 lks. wide, 6 ins. deep, flows SE.
- 11.30 Fence bears NW. and SE.
Over rolling land, leave sagebrush and enter scattering cedar.
- 21.65 Fence bears NE. and SW.
- 22.12 Fence bears NW. and SE.
- 25.85 To Cor. No. 2, identical with Cor. No. 5 of the listing survey, which is a cedar post, showing 3 ft. above ground, firmly set, mkd. and witnessed as described by the Surveyor General, in place of which I set a sandstone, 35 x 12 x 10 ins., 25 ins. in the ground, over broken glass, for Cor. No. 2 of this survey, mkd. 2-HES-118 on the side facing the claim and a cross (x) on top; and raise a mound of stone,
