

Chains

- 59.10 Corral fence bears E. and W.
Fence corner bears E., 1.00 ch. dist., from which
fences bear NE. and W.
- 59.60 To Cor. No. 6, about 70 ft. below point of descent,
identical with Cor. No. 6 of H. E. Survey No. 70
(accepted), which is a lava stone, showing 10 ins.
above ground, firmly set, mkd. and witnessed as
described by the Surveyor General. No trace of
Cor. No. 1 of the listing survey, which is identi-
cal with the Forest Service Monument, could be
found. This corner probably was destroyed in
connection with the survey of H. E. S. No. 70
(accepted). I mark the above stone 6-HES-132 on
the side facing the claim, for Cor. No. 6 of this
survey; and raise a mound of stone, 4 ft. base,
2 ft. high, $3\frac{1}{2}$ ft. dist., within the claim.
A lava rock, in place, showing $2 \times 1\frac{1}{2} \times 1$ ft. above
ground, mkd. and witnessed as described by the
Surveyor General, bears S. $17^{\circ} 39'$ W., 26 lks.
dist. I mark the rock 6-132.
A lava rock, in place, showing $4 \times 2\frac{1}{2} \times 1$ ft. above
ground, mkd. and witnessed as described by the
Surveyor General, bears S. $52^{\circ} 18'$ E., 44 lks.
dist. I mark the rock 6-132.
Thence
S. $89^{\circ} 53'$ W.,
Over level grassy bottom land.
Fence parallel to course, 10 lks. to the S.
- 1.44 Corral fence bears NE. and SW.
Leave grassland and enter cultivation, bears NE. and SW.
- 2.23 Ditch, 5 lks. wide, 6 ins. deep, flows S.
- 3.25 Center of east side of cow shed.
