listing survey and remark 1-HES-141 on the side
facing the claim, and a cross (x) on top for Cor.
No. 1 of this survey, and raise a mound of stone,
4 ft. base, 2 ft. high, $3\frac{1}{2}$ ft. dist., within the
claim.

A granite rock, showing 4 x 4 x 2 ft. above ground,
mkd. X-1-HES-141-BR, bears S. $4^{\circ} 39'$ E., 30 lks.

A granite rock, showing 3 x 2 x 2 ft. above ground,
mkd. X-1-HES-141-BR, bears N. $66^{\circ} 21'$ E., 25 lks.

U. S. Locating Monument No. 273 (unapproved), which
is a granite rock, in place, showing $2\frac{1}{2}$ x 2 x 2 ft.
above ground, mkd. X-USLM-273, and properly witnes-
sed by three bearing rocks and a pinon pine tree,
bears S. $34^{\circ} 52'$ W., 11.37 chs. dist.

I destroy the witnesses for the listing corner.
From U. S. Locating Monument No. 273, (unapproved),
heretofore described, Cor. No. 1 of H. E. Survey
No. 139, (unapproved), which is a malpais stone,
firmly set, showing 10 ins. above ground, mkd.
1-HES-139 on the SW. face, and a cross (x) on top,
bears S. $5^{\circ} 24' 15''$ W., 56.38 chs. dist., by tra-
verse as follows, computations of which are here-
to attached.
