U. S. Locating Monument No. 275 (unapproved), which is a granite rock, in place, showing 9 x 4 x 2 ft. above ground, mkd. X-USLM-275, and properly witnessed by two bearing rocks and two trees, and a mound of stone being in sight, bears S. 58° 45' W., 11.05 chs. dist.

Cor. No. 5 of H. E. Survey No. 85, (accepted), which is a limestone, showing 10 ins. above ground, firmly set, mkd. and witnessed <sup>as described</sup> by the Surveyor General, bears N. 3° 12' 33" E., 128.08 chs. dist., by traverse as follows, computations of which are hereto attached.

N. 2° 41' E., 54.88 "

N. 8° 20' W., 9.46 "

No. 2 of this survey, mkd. 2-HES-142 on the side facing the claim and a cross (x) on top. Dig pits 24 x 24 x 12 ins., crosswise on this and the succeeding course, 7 ft. dist., and raise a
