A basalt rock, in place, 8 x 7 ft., showing 6 ft. above

ground, mkd. X-1-HES-144-BR, bears S. $39^{\circ} 20'$ W.,

11 lks. dist.

The Forest Service Monument and Cor. No. 1 of the listing

survey, which is a basalt rock, in place, mkd. and

witnessed as described by the Surveyor General,

bears S. $40^{\circ} 00'$ W., 5 lks. dist.

I obliterate the markings on this monument and on the

witnesses thereto.

The position of this cor. was slightly changed in order

to get a better location for the cor.

The cor. of Secs. 3, 4, 33, and 34, Tps. 6 and 7 N., R.

47 E. (survey accepted), which is a basalt stone,

firmly set, mkd. and witnessed as described by

the Surveyor General, bears S. $63^{\circ} 51'$ W., 24.31

chs. dist., by traverse (computations of which are

hereto attached), as follows:

N. $84^{\circ} 24'$ W., 9.30 chs.

S. $52^{\circ} 49'$ W., 7.36 "

S. $43^{\circ} 03'$ W., 9.81 "

Over sagebrush land, descend.

2.30 Leave sagebrush, enter willows, bears NE. and SW. about

25 ft. below Cor. No. 1; over level bottom land.

2.45 Dry wash, course NE. Ascend.

7.00 Leave willows and enter sagebrush, bears N. and S.

8.20 Road bears NE. and SW.
