Chains

I destroy the witness to the listing cor. which was not suitable for a bearing object for this survey.

Thence

N. 28° 15' W.

Over sagebrush land.

Descend.

12.77 Van Duzer Creek, 25 lks. wide, 12 ins. deep, flows NE., about 125 ft. below Cor. No. 1.

Over level land.

15.50 End of fence; along fence.

16.69 To Cor. No. 2, identical with Cor. No. 1 of List 4-1912 and identical with Cor. No. 3 of List No. 4-751, which is an andesite stone, firmly set, mkd, as described by the Surveyor General, in place of which I set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 2 ins. in dia., equipped with a brass cap, 26 ins. in the ground, over broken glass for Cor. No. 2 of this survey; mkd. 2-HES-167 in the E. quadrant and a cross (x) in the center. No bearings, therefore dig pits, 24 x 24 x 12 ins., crosswise on this and the succeeding course, 7 ft. dist., and raise a mound of earth, 4 ft. base, 2 ft. high, 3½ ft. dist., within the claim.

Cor. No. 12 of H. E. S. No. 71 (accepted), which is a lava stone, firmly set, properly mkd., and witnessed by a mound of stone and by two bearing rocks, bears S.-60° 25' W.; 8.91 chs. dist., by traverse (computations of which are hereto attached) as follows:
