Chains

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Fence bears E. and W.

5.47 Road to Garrison, Utah, bears E. and W.

5.57 Leave sage, enter dense timber bears E. and W.

7.17 To Cor. No. 6, about 25 ft. above Lexington Creek, identical with Cor. No. 1 of H. E. Survey No. 155, (unapproved), which is a blue limestone, showing 10 ins. above ground, mkd. 1-HES-155 on the SW. face, and a cross (x) on top. I mk. this same stone 6-HES-184 on the SE. face, for Cor. No. 6 of this survey, and raise a mound of stone, 4 ft. base, 2 ft. high, 13 1/2 ft. dist., within the claim.

30.03 A pinon pine tree, 10 ins. in dia., blazed and scribed X-6-HES-184-BT, bears N. 41° 50' E., 16 lks. dist.

00.001 A pinon pine tree, 8 ins. in dia., blazed and scribed X-1-HES-155-BT, bears N. 52° 25' W., 61 lks. dist.

00.038 I mk. this same tree 6-184.

Cor. No. 1 of the listing survey, which is a cedar post, 36 x 4 x 4 ins., firmly set in a mound of rock, sets alongside Cor. No. 6 to the east. I destroy it and its witness.

Thence

S. 88° 21' E.

Descend over broken rolling land, through sage.

37.06 Ditch, 4 lks. wide, 6 ins. deep, flows NE.

37.16 Fence bears N. and S.

51.39 To Cor. No. 1, the place of beginning, about 46 ft. below Cor. No. 6.
