Chains

A pinon pine tree, 7 ins. in dia., blazed and scribed
X-3-HES-187-BT, bears N. 47° 53' E., 116 lks. dist.
A pinon pine tree, 6 ins. in dia., blazed and scribed
X-3-HES-187-BT, bears N. 57° 32' W., 132 lks. dist.
I destroy the witnesses for the listing corner.

Thence

S. 89° 11' E.

Over broken rolling land, through sage.

1.20 Road to Garrison, Utah, bears NW. and SE.

78.65 To Cor. No. 4, identical with Cor. No. 4 of H. E. Survey No. 148 (unapproved), which is a blue limestone, showing 10 ins. above ground, mkd. 4-HES-148 on the SE. face and a cross (x) on top, and properly witnessed by pits and a mound of earth. I mk. this same rock, 4-HES-187 on the SW. face, for Cor. No. 4 of this survey. No bearings, therefore dig a pit, 24 x 24 x 12 ins. on line, N. 89° 11' W., 7 ft. dist., and raise a mound of earth, 4 ft. base, 2 ft. high, 3½ ft. dist., within the claim.
Cor. No. 5 of the listing survey, which is a cedar post, mkd. as described by the Surveyor General, sets alongside the above cor. to the east. I destroy it.

Thence

S. 0° 47' E.

Over level land, through sage, on a true line bet. Cors. 4-3 of H. E. Survey No. 148.

1.49 Road to Garrison, Utah, bears E. and W.

3.73 Leave cottonwoods, enter sage, bears E. and W.

4.55 Big Wash Creek, 15 lks. wide, 6 ins. deep, flows SE.

4.93 Leave sage, enter cottonwoods, bears E. and W.

5.83 To Cor. No. 1, the place of beginning.
