

Chains

A granite rock outcrop, showing 2 x 2 x 2 ft. above ground, mkd. X-7-HES-188-BR, bears N. 12° 09' W., 35 lks. dist. I destroy the witness for the listing corner.

S. 59° 48' E.
Over broken rolling land, through sagebrush.

19.30 Road to Sharp, Nevada, bears E. and W.

21.30 Fence bears E. and W.

24.20 Fence bears N. and S.

27.95 To Cor. No. 8, identical with Cor. No. 8 of H. E. Survey No. 116, which is a granite stone, showing 20 ins. above ground, firmly set, mkd. 8-HES-116 on the SE. face, and a cross (x) on top, and properly witnessed by pits and a mound of earth. I mk. this same stone, 8-HES-188 on the SW. face, for Cor. No. 8 of this survey, and dig a pit, 24 x 24 x 12 ins., crosswise on line, N. 59° 48' W., 7 ft. dist., and raise a mound of earth, 4 ft. base, 2 ft. high, 3½ ft. dist., within the claim.

A cedar tree, 10 ins. in dia., blazed and scribed X-8-HES-188-BT, bears S. 5° 18' W., 110 lks. dist.

Cor. No. 1 of the listing survey, which is a cedar post, 36 x 3 x 3 ins., mkd. and witnessed as described by the Surveyor General, firmly set along side to the west of Cor. No. 8 of H. E. Survey No. 116 (unapproved), heretofore described. I destroy this cor. and its witness.
