

## HOMESTEAD ENTRY SURVEY NO. 191,

## HUMBOLDT NATIONAL FOREST

## STATE OF NEVADA

Chains

BEGINNING AT COR. NO. 1 of this survey, identical with Cor. No. 4 of H. E. Survey No. 190 (unapproved), which is a blue stone, showing 10 ins. above ground, firmly set, mkd. 4-HES-190 on the NW. face, a cross (x) on top, and properly witnessed by pits and a mound of earth. I mk. this stone 1-HES-191 on the NE. face, for Cor. No. 1 of this survey. No bearings, therefore dig a pit 24 x 24 x 12 ins., crosswise on line, N. 89° 46' E., 7 ft. dist., and raise a mound of earth, 4 ft. base, 2 ft. high, 3½ ft. dist., NE. of cor.

U. S. Locating Monument No. 290 (unapproved), which is a blue limestone, in place, showing 10 x 8 x 6 ft. above ground, mkd. X-USLM-290, and witnessed by a mound of stone and three bearing objects, bears N. 84° 27' W., 23.16 chs. dist., by traverse as follows, computations of which are hereto attached:

S. 86° 50' W., 20.05 chains

N. 42° 09' W., 4.52 "

Cor. No. 1 of H. E. Survey No. 190 (approved), which is a lime sandstone, showing 15 ins. above ground, firmly set, mkd. 1-HES190 on the NE. face, and witnessed by pits and a mound of stone, bears S. 86° 50' W., 20.05 chs. dist.

Cor. No. 1 of the listing survey, which is a blue limestone, mkd. as described by the Surveyor General, sets alongside of the above cor. I destroy it.

Thence

N. 0° 27' W.

Over level land, through sagebrush.
