Chains

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iron post, 3 ft. long, 2 ins. in dia., equipped with a brass cap, 26 ins. in the ground, over broken glass, for Cor. No. 1 of this survey; mkd. 1-HES-205 in the SE quadrant and a cross (x) in the center. No bearings, therefore, dig pits, 24 x 24 x 12 ins., crosswise on this and the succeeding course, 7 ft. dist., and raise a mound of earth and stone, 4 ft. base, 2 ft. high, 3 1/2 ft. dist., within the claim.

The closing corner on the E. boundary of Secs. 14 and 23, T. 46 N., R. 53 E. (survey accepted), which is an iron post, with a brass cap, firmly set in a mound of earth and witnessed by pits on line N. and S.; mkd. CC-S-14-S-23-DVIR, bears N. 78° 53' W., 64.12 chs. dist., by traverse (computations of

which are hereto attached) as follows:

N. 89° 20' W., 59.30

N. 17° 13' W., 12.22

Thence

N. 73° 28' E.

Over sagebrush land.

Descend.

3.40 Road to Mountain City, bears NW. and SE.

3.75 Leave sagebrush; enter willows and aspen, bear NW. and SE.

4.25 Brown's Gulch Creek, 3 lks. wide, 6 ins. deep, flows SE., about 45 ft. below Cor. No. 1.

Ascend.

5.10 Leave willows and aspen; enter sagebrush, bears NW. and SE.

13.15 To Cor. No. 2, about 75 ft. above Brown's Gulch Creek,

identical with Cor. No. 5 of the listing survey,

which is a blue limestone, firmly set, mkd. as des-

cribed by the Surveyor General, in place of which
