A slight change in the location of this cor. was made in order to obtain a more secure position for the corner. General description of Cor. No. 4 of H. E. S. No. 132 (accepted), which is a lava stone, firmly set, showing 3 x 10 x 6 ins. above ground, properly marked and witnessed by pits and mound of earth, being in sight, bears S. 69° 40' W., 5.07 chs. dist. (x) in the U. S. Locating Monument No. 295, which is a granite rock in place, showing 4 x 4 x 2 ft. above ground, marked X-USLM-295 on the S. face and witnessed by two bearing rocks and by a mound of stone, 6 ft. base, 4 ft. high to the NW., 15 lks. dist., being in sight, bears S. 77° 33' E., 8.29 chs. dist.

To Cor. No. 2, identical with Cor. No. 2 of the listing survey, which is a lava stone, firmly set, marked and described by the Surveyor General, in place of which I set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 2 ins. in dia., equipped with a brass cap, 1 1/2 ins. in ground to bedrock and supported by a mound of stone, for Cor. No. 2 of this survey, marked 2-HES-207 in the S. quadrant and a cross (x) in the center. Pits impracticable. (x) No bearing objects available. 4 ft. base, 2 ft. high, 3 1/2 ft. dia. in the claim. Pits impracticable. No bearing objects available.
