No. 2 of this survey, and dig a pit, 24 x 24 x 12 ins., crosswise on line S. $1^{\circ} 33'$ W., 7 ft. dist., and raise a mound of earth, 4 ft. base, 2 ft. high, $3\frac{1}{2}$ ft. dist., within the claim.
