From this observation I calculate the bearing of Cor. No. 5 of this survey as N.  $89^{\circ} 34' 07''$  E. and to the corresponding meridian all courses of this survey are referred.

RETRACEMENT

Beginning at Cor. No. 7 of H. E. S. No. 74 (accepted) which is a lava stone, firmly set, 12 x 4 ins., showing 10 ins. above ground, mkd. 7-HES-74 on the N. face, and a cross (x) on the top, and witnessed by pits and a mound of earth. Cor. No. 8 of H. E. S. No. 74 (accepted), being in sight, I run

Thence

S.  $65^{\circ} 47'$  W.

On a true line between Cors. 7 and 8 of H. E. S. No. 74 (accepted).

29.98 Set a temporary stake for Cor. No. 2 of this survey.

63.80 To Cor. No. 8 of H. E. S. No. 74 (accepted), which is a lime stone, firmly set, 8 x 6 ins., showing 10 ins. above ground, mkd. 8-HES-74 on the N. face and a cross (x) on the top and witnessed by pits and a mound of earth.

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BEGINNING AT COR. NO. 1 of this survey, for which I set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 2 ins dia., equipped with brass cap, 26 ins. in the ground, over broken glass, mkd. 1-HES-223 in the NE. quadrant, and a cross (x) in the center for Cor. No. 1 of this survey. No bearings, therefore dig pits, 24 x 24 x 12 ins., crosswise on line N. and E., 7 ft. dist., and raise a mound of earth, 4 ft. base, 2 ft. high,
