(accepted) and identical with Cor. No. 1 of H.

E. S. No. 132 (accepted), which is a lava stone

firmly set, showing 10 ins. above ground, mkd.

5-HES-70 on the SE. face, 1-HES-132 on the NE.

face and a cross (x) on the top; and witnessed

by pits and mounds of earth and stone. I take

the cross (X) on this stone for chaining and an-

gle point for Cor. No. 3 of this survey, and in

addition mk. it 3-HES-236 on the SW. face. Dig

a pit 24 x 24 x 12 ins. crosswise on line S. 75°

57' W., 7 ft. dist., and raise a mound of earth

and stone, 4 ft. base, 2 ft. high 3½ ft. dist.,

within the claim.
