Chains

mkd. X-6-HES-165 on the NE. face and a cross (x)
 on the top, and witnessed by pits and mound of
 earth. I take the cross (x) on this stone, for
 chaining and angle point for Cor. No. 2 of this
 survey, and in addition mark it 2-HES-237 on the
 SW face. No bearings, therefore, dig pits, 24 x 24
 x 12 ins., crosswise on this and the succeeding
 course, 7 ft dist., and raise a mound of earth,
 4 ft. base, 2 ft. high $3\frac{1}{2}$ ft. dist., within the claim.
 Cor. No. 5 of H.E.S. No. 106 (accepted), which is a
 granite outcrop, showing 5 x 4 x 2 ft. above
 ground, mkd. X-5-HES-106 on the SE. face, and
 witnessed by a mound of stone, and by two bearing
 rocks, being in sight, bears S. $11^{\circ} 18'$ E., 13.47
 chs. dist.
 Thence
 S. $89^{\circ} 33'$ E.,
 On a true line bet. Cors. 6 and 5 of H.E. Survey No.
 165 (approved).
 Over sagebrush land, Descend
 1.70 Fence Cor. from which fences bear N. 10° W., and S. 89°
 $33'$ E.
 Along fence.
 5.90 Sheep Creek, 10 lks. wide, 6 ins. deep, flows N. about
 30 ft. below Cor. No. 2.
 Over level bottom land.
 Leave sagebrush, enter willows, bear N. and S.
 10.20 Leave willows, enter sagebrush, bears N. and S.
 Ascend.
 11.60 Fence Cor., from which fences bear S. $89^{\circ} 33'$ E.,
 N. $89^{\circ} 33'$ W., and South.
 Ascend.
 17.00 To Cor. No. 3, about 75 ft. above point of ascent,
 identical with Cor. No. 5 of H.E. Survey No.
