Parker Fraction (unsurveyed) A.B.Lind Claimant.

Topography.

This claim is situated on a gently rolling slope
1-1/2 miles N.Westerly from base of Mount Oddie.

Instruments.

A. Leitz & Company Transit No. 0523 and a
standard Steel tape 500 ft. long made by or for H. S.
Crocker Company of San Francisco, Calif.

Bearings are deflected from the true meridian estab-
lished from observations on Polaris at its elongation.
This meridian is the one from which the bearings of all
surveys made by me in this District are deflected and
the one used for nearly all surveys made in this
District by other Deputy Mineral Surveyors, and has been
checked by the meridian established by the U. S. Coast
and Geodetic Survey and marked by stone piers about 1
mile apart.

The latitude was determined by a Saeg-muller solar
attachment used with A. Leitz Company transit and was
found to be N. $38^{\circ} 04'$.

The latitude established by The U.S.Coast and Geodetic
Survey at the S. stone pier is N. $38^{\circ} 04' 04''$.

Report.

The E. 1/4 Cor. Sec. 34 T. 2 N., R. No. 42 E. Mount
Diablo Base and Meridian is marked by a porphyry stone
4 x 10 x 16 ins., marked or scratched 1/4 to the W.
surrounded by a mound of stone.

The N. 1/4 Cor. Sec. 34 was placed upon a ridge sloping
in all directions but one and has been thrown down or
rolled down and its monument scattered.

The N.W. Cor of Sec. 34 was thrown down probably by
prospectors and used as a monument some distance away
