

Survey No. 2200

A Shop 14 X 16 ft., the S.E. Cor. of which, and mouth of tunnel (now caved), bears from Cor. No. 1 Gold Medal Lode N. 74° 50' W. 119 ft. Course of long sides S. 78° W. Said shop and tunnel belong to Claimant herein.

INSTRUMENT.

This survey was made with a Gurley Light Mountain Transit. The courses were deflected from the true Meridian as determined by observation on Polaris. The distances were measured with 100 ft. and 200 ft. steel tapes.

DESCRIPTION OF CORNERS.

The 1/4 Sec. Cor. between Secs. 15 and 16, T. 20 N. R. 40 E., Mt. Diablo Mer., is a conglomerate stone 14 X 18 X 7 ins., set in a pile of stone, marked 1/4 on West side.

Cor. No. 1, ^{Sw} U.S.S. No. 38, Gold Belt, ^{No} Lode is a Pinyon post, 3 ins. diam., 2-1/2 ft. above ground in mound of rock, blazed and scribed P.I. U.S.S. 38. No other original stake of this claim was found but small cedar posts, unmarked, apparently recently set, occupied relatively the positions of posts Nos. 2, 3, and 4.

Cor. No. 3 ^{Sw} U.S.S. No. 37 A., Superior Lode, is a sawed pine post 2 X 4 ins., 16 ins. above ground, badly decomposed, in mound of rock, scribed P. 3 U.S.S. 37 A.

No other original stake of this claim was found, but small cedar posts, unmarked, apparently recently set, occupied relatively the positions of posts 1, 2, and 4.

Note: After diligent search, I was unable to find any Cor. of the U.S. Land Surveys nearer than the 1/4 Sec. Cor. between Secs. 15 and 16, T. 20 N. R. 40 E.

To find this corner, I began at a pile of rock said to be the Cor. to Secs. 25--26--35 and 36 of said Tp. and Rg.
