Instruments

This survey was made with an A. Lietz Company Transit No. 0523. The bearings were deflected from the true meridian as established by observations on Polaris at its elongation. This meridian is the one from which all surveys made by me in this camp have been deflected by plate angles and has been checked by the meridian established by the U. S. Coast and Geodetic Survey and marked by stone piers about one mile apart.

The distances were measured with a 650 ft. standard steel tape.

Report

The E. 1/4 Cor. Sec. 34, T. 3 N., R. 42 E., Mount Diablo Base and Meridian, is a porphyry stone 16 ins long, 10 ins. wide, and 4 ins. thick, scratched 1/4 to the West (not chiseled) surrounded by a monument of stone.

Cor. No. 1, Sur. No. 2188 Bermuda Lode Quartz Claim, is a pine post 4-1/2 ft. long, 4 ins square, set 18 ins. in the ground, scribed 1-2188, with mound of earth and stone 2 ft. high built up around the post

Cor. No. 4, Sur. No. 2188 Bermuda Lode Quartz Claim, is a pine post 4-1/2 ft. long, 4 ins. square, set 12 ins. in the ground, scribed 4-2188 with a mound of earth and stone 4 ft. in dia. at base built up around it 2 ft. high.
