An office building, size 20 x 60 ft., the N. E. Cor. of which bears N. 38°36' W. 398 ft. from Cor. No. 2, New year's Gift lode. Course of long sides is South.

## INSTRUMENT

This survey was made with a Buff & Berger Mountain Transit. The corners were deflected from the true meridian as determined by an observation on Polaris at its eastern elongation. The distances were measured with 500, 300 and 100 ft. steel tapes.

## SURFACE

The surface embraced by this claim is low, rolling hills, void of timber and other natural objects for bearings.

NOTE: The identity of the corners of this survey is accounted for by the fact that the locations were made by actual survey. The differences in the length of lode lines, as shown in this survey, and as given in original location certificates, is due to errors in the latter.

## REPORT

The government section corners, reported in this survey, are described as follows: Cor. to Secs. 34 and 35, T. 28 S., R. 63 H., M. D. M., is a rock 12 x 12 ins., set in a mound of stone and earth, chiseled two notches east, four west and six north. Cor. to Secs. 2 and 3 T. 29 S., R. 63 E., M. D. M., is a rock set in a mound of stone and earth, chiseled two notches east, four west and six south.
