An open cut 4 x 8 ft. face, 10 ft. long, in rock, the face of which bears from Cor. No. 3, Bodie No. 2 Lode, S.34° 31'W. 954.8 ft.

The main working shaft, described under Improvement No. 2, is located upon the Gipsy Queen Lode; this shaft is well timbered and so situated upon this claim, at practically the point of lowest elevation, as to be a most advantageous means of development, through one system of workings, for each of the veins of the several locations. It is the intention of the company when sufficient depth has been reached to develop the veins, by a system of Northerly and Easterly crosscuts, through this one shaft.

An undivided 1/4 interest in this main shaft is applied upon each location of this survey.

The remaining improvements are applied upon the lodes upon which they are located.

INSTRUMENTS

This survey was made with an A. Lietz Co. Transit No. 0523.

The bearings were deflected from the true meridian established by the U.S. Coast and Geodetic Survey and marked by stone piers set about one mile apart.

All the bearings were checked by direct solar observation and found to be correct.

The distances were measured with a 650 ft. standard steel tape.

REPORT

Description of Corners.

N.W. Cor. Sec. 36, is a rhyolite stone 18 x 14 x 9 ins., set on top of ground, surrounded by mound of stone and chiseled with one notch on both E. and S. faces.
