2. An open cut, the face of which bears from Cor. No. 4 S.  $7^{\circ} 50' W$ . 329.5 ft. 3 ft. wide, 3-1/2 ft. face, 13 ft. long, with a shaft at the end 4 x 6 ft. 35 ft. deep.

Value \$450.00

UPON THE LODE CLAIM.

The main working shaft which bears from Cor. No. 4 Hidden Gem Lode, S.  $59^{\circ} 39' 30'' W$ . 558.0 ft. 4 x 10 ft. 42 ft. deep, in rock.

Value \$630.00

It is the intention of the claimants to develop the locations of this survey through this shaft. When a sufficient depth has been reached, crosscuts to the veins, and drifts thereon will be run, thereby opening up the ore bodies at great depth.

An undivided 1/2 interest in this improvement is applied upon each location of this survey.

The remaining improvements are credited to the location upon which they are situated.

A shaft which bears from Cor. No. 5 Daylight Lode S.  $0^{\circ} 35' W$ . 81.0 ft. 4 x 6 ft. 27 ft. deep.

INSTRUMENTS

This survey was made with an A. Lietz Co. Transit No. 0523.

The courses were deflected by plate angles from the true meridian as established by the U. S. Coast and Geodetic Survey and marked by stone piers about one mile apart.

The distances were measured with a 650 ft. standard steel tape.
