INSTRUMENT

This survey was made with a Buff ^{2nd} Berger Mountain Transit. The courses were deflected from the true meridian as determined by an observation on Polaris at its eastern elongation. The distances were measured with 100 and 300 ft. steel tapes.

SURFACE

The surface embraced by this claim is low range of rolling hills, void of timber and other natural objects for bearings.

NOTE:---The identity of the corners of this survey is accounted for by the fact that the locations were made from actual survey. The difference^s between these field notes and the location certificate of the Sarah Nevada lode with regard to the length of the lode line, is due to error in the latter

REPORT

The government section corner reported in this survey is described as follows; the corner of sections 31-32 on the Seventh Standard Parallel South, T. 28 S. R. 64 E. M. D. B. & M. is a rock 12x12 ins. square, 18 ins. long, set in a mound of stone and earth.

Cor. No. 17-23 Sur. No. 1955 Chief of the Hills and Indian lode, is a pine post 4 ins. square, showing 2 ft. above a mound of earth and stone, scribed 17-23-1955

Cor. No. 16 Sur. No. 1955 Chief of the Hills lode, is a pine post 4 ins. square, showing 2 ft. above a mound of earth and stone, scribed 16-1955.
