

SURVEY NO. 2473.

INSTRUMENT.

This survey was made with a Gurley Light Mountain Transit. The courses were deflected from the true meridian as determined by direct solar observations.

The distances were measured with 50 and 100 foot steel tapes.

NOTE: The disagreements between these field notes and the location certificates, as to the location of discovery work and the boundary lines of the Denver No. 1 No. 2, No. 3 No. 4, No. 6 and No. 8 Lodes are due to errors in the latter.

REPORT.

FIRST: The U.S. Govt. 1/4 Cor. to which connection is given in these field notes is a quartzite stone 8 x 10 x 18 ins. chiseled 1/4 and has a mound of stone 2 ft. high and 2 ft. N. of it. It is situated 40 chains E. of the N.W. Cor. Sec. 3 T. 44 N. R. 57 E. which is marked by a quartzite stone 6 x 10 x 18 ins. chiseled with three notches on the E. and W. faces of the stone, with a mound of stone 3 ft. N. of the corner.
