

Survey No. 2506.

Instrument.

This survey was made with a Buff & Buff Light Mountain Transit.

The courses were deflected from the true meridian as determined by direct solar observations.

The distances were measured with 50 ft. and 500 ft. steel tape.

Report.

1/4 Sec Cor. on E. side Sec. 34, T. 3 N., R. 42 E., M.D.M., is a porphyry stone 16 x 10 x 4 ins. scratched 1/4 on W. face, set in mound of stone.

Cors. Nos. 1, 2, and 3, Sur. No. 2295 Z.Z.Z. lode are pine posts 4 x 4 ins. 2 1/2 ft. above ground in a mound of earth and stone, scribed respectively 1-2295, 2-2295, and 3-2295.

Cors. Nos. 3 and 4, Sur. No. 2295 Red Rock No. 2 lode are pine posts 4 x 4 ins. 2 1/2 ft. above ground in mounds of earth and stone, scribed respectively 3-2295, and 4-2295.- 3- 2295

Cor. No. 3, Sur. No. 2295 Z.Z.Z.Z. lode is a pine post 4 x 4 ins. 2 1/2 ft. above ground in mound of earth and stone, scribed 3-2295.

Cor. No. 1, Sur. No. 2188 Bermuda lode is a pine post 4 x 4 ins. 2 1/2 ft. above ground in mound of earth and stone, scribed 1-2188.

Cor. No. 2, Sur No. 2190 Paymaster lode is a pine post 4 x 4 ins. 2 1/2 ft. above ground in a mound of earth and stone, scribed 2-2190.

The N.E. Cor., E. side line Cor., and S.E. Cor. of the Accidental lode (unsurveyed) are pine posts 4 x 4 ins. 2 1/2 ft. above ground in mounds of earth and stone marked respectively, N.E. Cor. Accidental, E. side line Cor. Accidental, and S.E. Cor Accidental.
