I N S T R U M E N T

This survey was made with an A. Lietz Co. Transit No. 0523.

The courses were deflected by plate angles from the true Meridian as established by the U. S. Coast and Geodetic Survey and marked by stone piers about one mile apart.

The distances were measured with a 650 ft. standard steel tape

DESCRIPTION OF CORNERS.

The W. $1/4$ Cor. Sec. 34, T. 3 N. , R. 42 E. Mount Diablo Base and Meridian is a porphyry rock, 4 x 8 ins. 9 ins. above ground, chiseled $1/4$ on the West face.

Cor. No. 4 Survey No. 2276, Table Mountain No. 5 Lode, identical with Cor. No. 4, Sur. No. 2477, Spike Lode, is a pine post 4 ins. square, 3.3 ft. above ground scribed 4-2276 and 4-2477.

Cor. No. 3 Sur. No. 2477, Spike Lode, is a pine post 4- $1/2$ ft. long, 4 ins. square, set 18 ins. in ground and mound of earth and stone, scribed 3-2477.

Cor. No. 5, Sur. No. 2484, Lottery Lode, is a pine post 4- $1/2$ ft. long, 4 ins. square, set 18 ins. in ground and mound of earth and stone, scribed 5-2484.

Cor. No. 2, ^{Sur No 2187} Cats Paw Mine Lode, is a pine post 4 $1/2$ ft. long, 4 ins. square, set 18 ins. in ground and mound of earth and stone, scribed 2-2187.
